RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF PROPERTY OWNED BY THE BOARD AND NO LONGER NEEDED FOR ANY SCHOOL PURPOSE TO TIM PUTERBAUGH

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Bradford Exempted Village School District is the owner of the property located at 712 North Miami Avenue and West Klinger Road, Bradford, Ohio, designated as Miami County tax parcel numbers H18-250025, H18-250020, and H18-250079, inclusive of the improvements thereon, County of Miami, State of Ohio (the %Broperty+), which is no longer needed for any school purpose; and

WHEREAS, the value of the Property exceeds Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000); and

WHEREAS, the Board has complied with the requirements of Ohio Revised Code Section 3313.41, prior to negotiating a private sale of the Property; and

WHEREAS, Tim Puterbaugh has expressed an interest in acquiring the Property; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Puterbaugh and the Superintendent have negotiated terms and conditions of a private sale of the Property.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Property owned by the Board of Education is no longer needed for school purposes; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board has complied with the provisions of Revised Code Section 3313.41, prior to the Superintendent negotiating a private sale of the Property; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the terms and conditions of sale, as negotiated between the Superintendent and Mr. Puterbaugh, and set forth in the Real Estate Purchase Contract, are agreeable to the Board; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the sale of the Property, as set forth in the Real Estate Purchase Contract, is approved by the Board, and the Board and Treasurer are hereby authorized to execute the appropriate deeds and such other documents as are necessary to effectuate the sale, and the Board President, Treasurer and Superintendent are directed to do all things necessary and consistent with this Resolution to effectuate the sale provided for herein, and to expend the funds incidental to carrying this resolution into effect; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Board concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Board, and that all deliberations of this Board that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with the law.
