



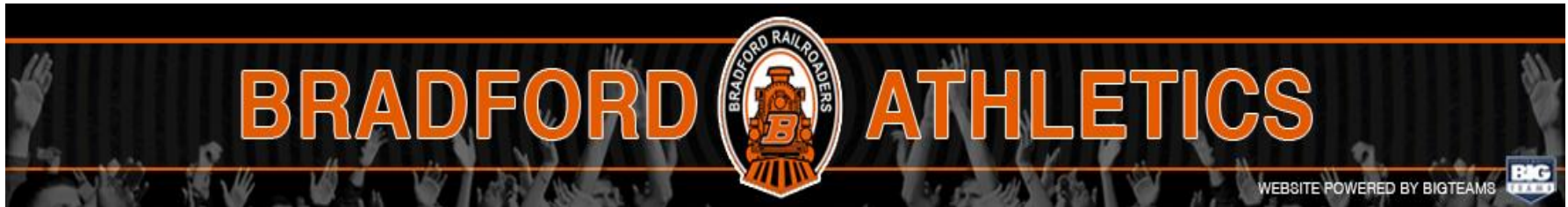
# Transportation
